Norman foresters communities is an association.

This association brings together Norman communities in a structure for exchanging and sharing experiences. This communities could own forests or not. It offers multiple animation and support services like:

- promote forest areas and place forests and wood at the heart of local development.
- More than 1 000 local elected officials take on the role of forest representative for their community,
- Training of these local elected officials
- We mediate between residents and foresters when problems appear (woodcutting, coming out of the woods onto the roads, new species, climate change),

























Some of these changes are contested, which delays the necessary adaptations.

Our project seeks to imagine and test information and dialogue tools:

- lead debates on controversial subjects
- creation of an educational game
- theatrical forest visit (picture below)

conference debate on the consequences of climate change in forest.



All our actions are designed and organized by a group including foresters (private and public), communities, natural parks, and naturalist associations.























The main innovation is to create a network of organizations with different points of view, and to make them work together on projects and actions.

This allows for a better understanding of everyone's objectives, then to consider shared governance of forest management.

The network has worked on several projects and this common work is now considered necessary, useful and ordinary for most subjects, by all network partners.























Sharing your organization's goals in complete transparency is essential, but it requires a great deal of trust in your partners and an ability to understand their challenges and strategies. It is also the most fragile thing to create and maintain. It

requires continuous effort.

But the results confirm that this is the right way.
